Ursula has a passion for arts and crafts, and she continues to make some great pieces with her sewing machine and creating craft pieces.


Betty had a good time doing the Valentine's Day crafts and enjoys having a singalong while she does her art and craft work.



Armchair trave included I visiting all the scenic destinations and learning all about an amazing country with the trivia and quizzes.














Residents have enjoyed the bus outings this month to the leagues club for live entertainment, lunch, singing and dancing.














A good morning was had with anticipation on getting dealt a good hand and taking a shot at some luck.
