INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT MARCH

What is Pi Day all about? Math, science, pies and more... The holiday is on Thursday, March 14, due to the fact 3/14 correlates with the first three digits of the mathematical constant - an infinite number with many practical uses. Math enthusiasts around the world, from college kids to rocket scientists, celebrate Pi Day

Albert Einstein was born in Ulm, in the Kingdom of Württemberg in the German Empire, on 14 March 1879.

Monopoly – one of the nation's favourite family board games. Monopoly was invented on March 7th 1933. There were other versions of the game starting as early as 1902, but the version closest to what we play today was created in 1933. There are now so many different versions and special editions.

Telephone – on March 7th 1876, Alexander Graham Bell patented the first telephone. Three days later he made the world's first phone call to his assistant in the next room.

Coca Cola – this was originally invented in March 1886 as patent medicine by John Pemberton. It has developed and changed over the years to become the soft drink we know today.

Washing Machine – on March 28th 1797, Nathaniel Briggs patented the first washing machine. The system has evolved over the years to be powered by electricity rather than man-power!

Rubber Band – on March 17th 1845, the rubber band was invented. How would we live without them?

Clothing Labels

Residents are also welcome to use their own hairdresser at any time or go out to a private hair salon with family.

Meals

Families and Friends are welcome to order and enjoy a meal through our main kitchen to have with their loved ones. The cost is \$5.00 per meal payable to Admin or through the kitchen.

Please let the kitchen know you would like a meal organised approx. 2 hours before scheduled mealtimes.

Going Out?

Please let the staff know and sign in **and** out of the Resident Leave Record book located in the Main Foyer.

Relatives Details / EPOAs

Next of Kin or relevant persons please alert staff if you; change your address, phone number, or contact details. We can then update your details.

Maintenance Issues?

Do you have a light that needs replacing? Tap that is leaky? Residents now have access to a Maintenance request book, located near the lounge area. All families, staff, and residents can now log any issues that they would like Maintenance to have a look at. Logbooks will be checked daily by our maintenance officer, Brody.

COVID-19 Updates

Although QLD health has recently relaxed guidelines for mask wearing and other entry precautions, aged care facility site managers can implement additional entry guidelines to minimise risks to vulnerable residents.

Under the current traffic light system, Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) for visitors are required every 72 hours, and mask wearing is encouraged, but not mandatory.

Please check for any updates near the visitor sign in registers.
