ARIIA Project Update

- A new **Carer Team Leader** role will commence from 12th January for a three-month trial period Four staff members have been selected to participate in trialling this new position:
 - Ritesh Chand, Craig Lauder, Melissa Aleki, and Fuatai Pule
- The Administration role will be trialled as a full-time position
- Nursing staff will now be reporting directly to the Clinical Nurse (CN)

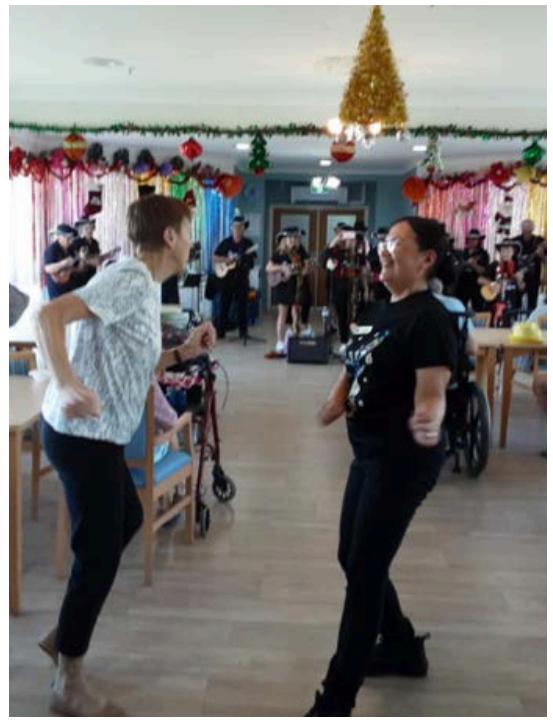
Residents have enjoyed making a vanilla slice and Christmas chocolate balls in cooking sessions.
