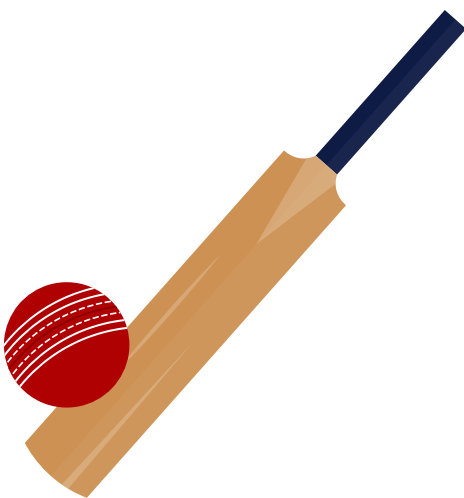


Alf Hampson
