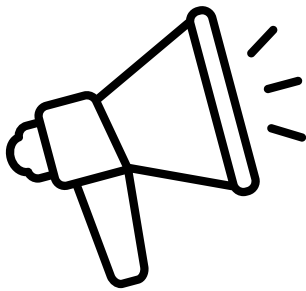

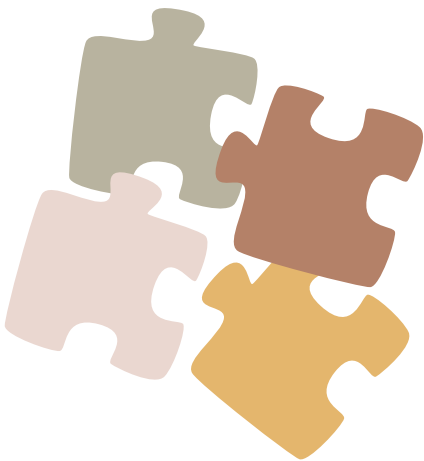
Finishing off the week with a Lovely Themed High tea with plenty of green, along with the Leprechaun hat table decorations made for the occasion at craft.

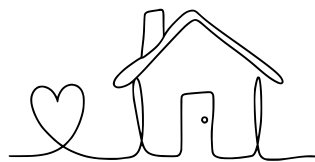
