What's coming in May



We will commence the month of May by acknowledging World Hand Hygiene Day on Tuesday, 5 May. to feed the
birds.**



Magpies, ibises, and other birds should not be fed human food because it can lead to serious health issues and nutritional imbalances. Human food often lacks the essential nutrients that birds need to thrive in the wild. Feeding them human food can cause digestive problems, lead to obesity, and result in weakened bones due to a lack of calcium. Additionally, feeding them human food can cause them to rely on humans for food, which can be detrimental to their natural behaviour and health.

Environmental Impact

Providing food can disrupt local ecosystems. Birds that become dependent on handouts often neglect natural foraging behaviours. This shift affects the balance of the local food chain. For example, native plants may struggle if birds ignore their seeds. Allowing birds to find their own food helps maintain a healthy environment for you and them.

Expression of Interest: Join Our Community Advisory Board (CAB)

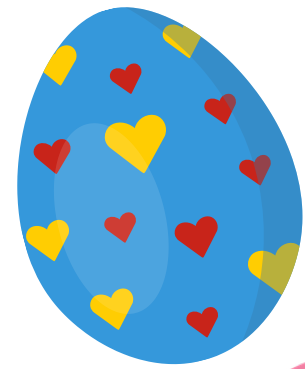
We are seeking expressions of interest from residents, community members, family representatives and carers who would like to join our Community Advisory Board (CAB)

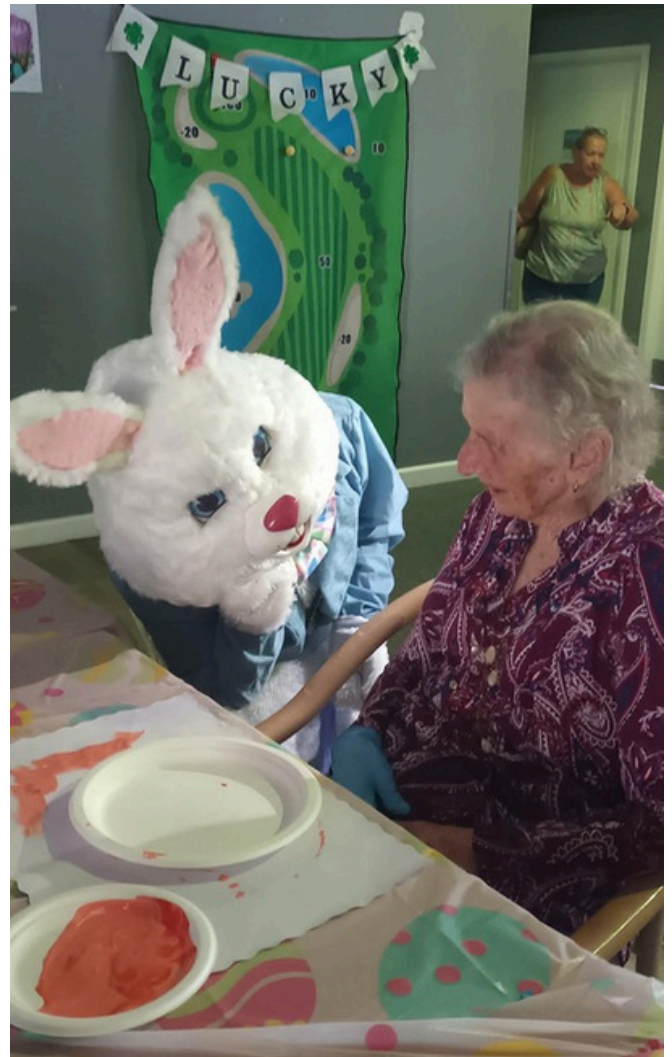

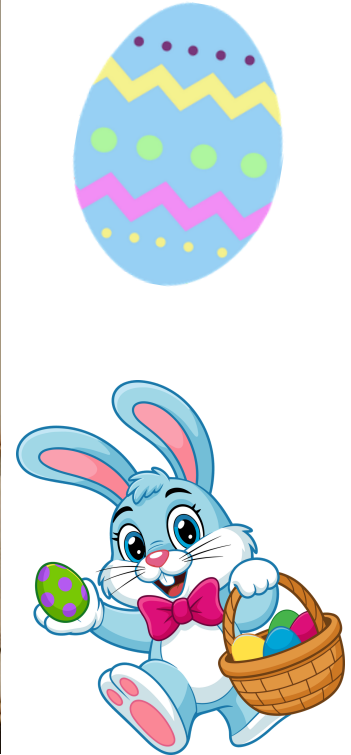


EASTER

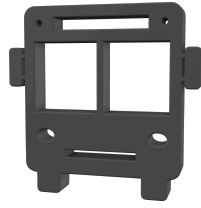

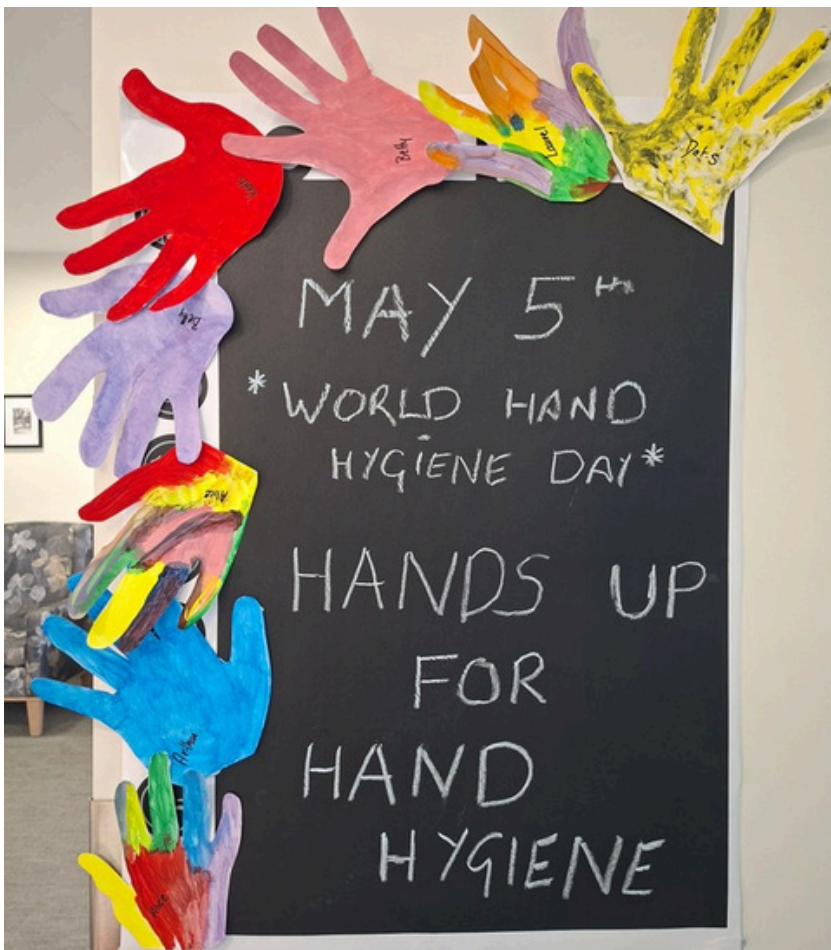
Residents enjoyed a morning out shopping before sitting down to relax and enjoy morning tea together.
