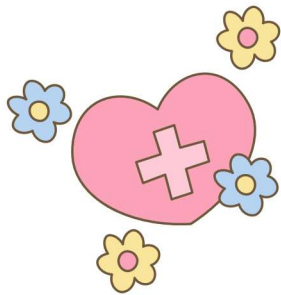


CLINICAL NURSE - SINA

Ariana is continuing to establish friendships and sing all the residents favourites room side weekly.



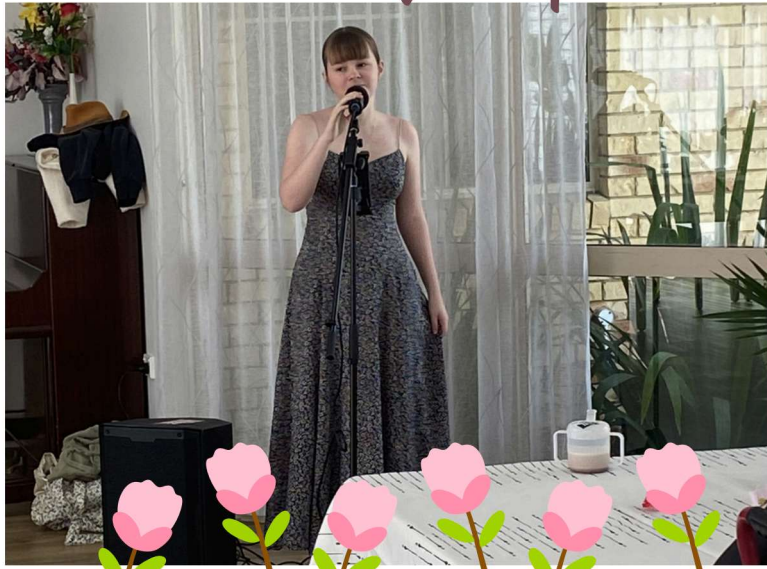
BEAUMONT *Mother's Day*

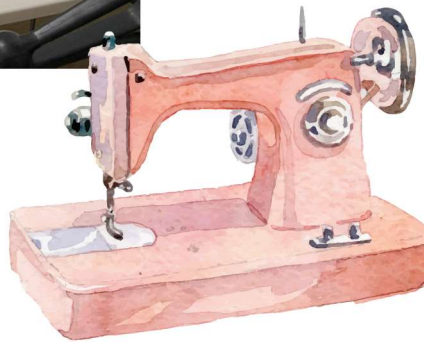


BEAUMONT *Arts and Crafts*

Poker is a definite favourite with a beverage and some snacks for them to enjoy.

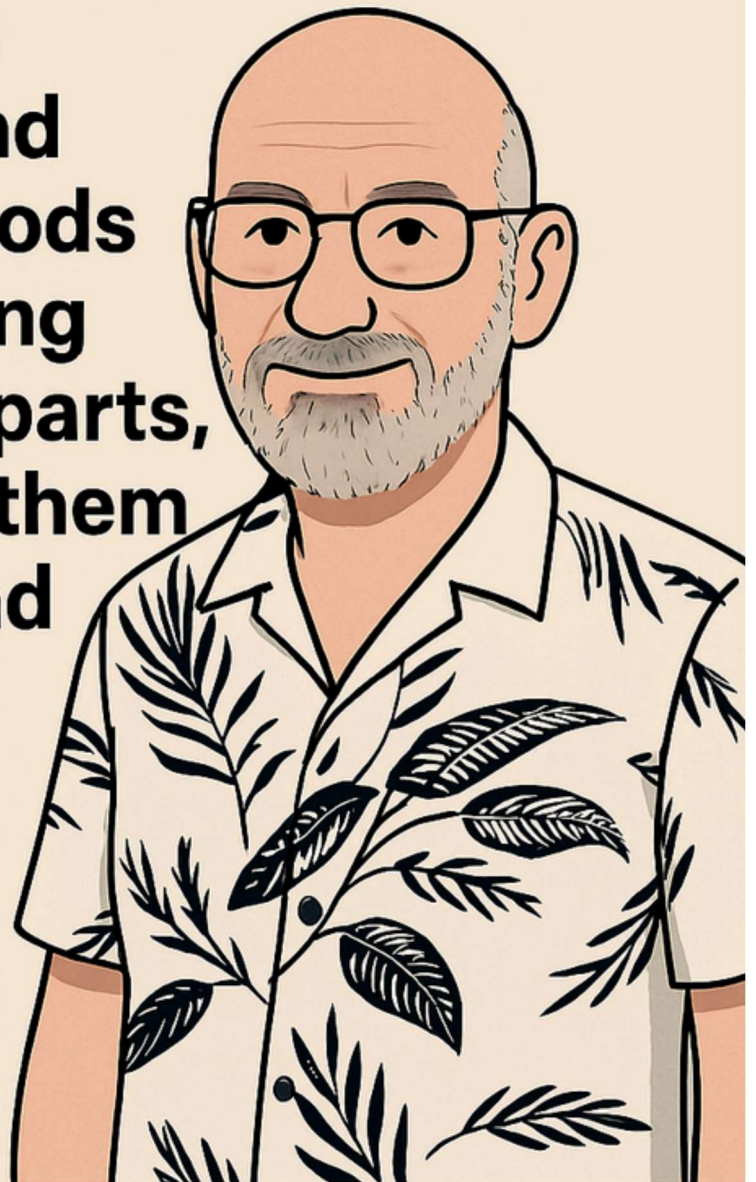
