Friday the 29th of May marks my final day with the company, as my family and I set off to spend the next couple of years travelling our great country.

I wanted to take a moment to reflect on what has been a truly rewarding time and to thank each of you for being part of this journey.

It has been a privilege to work alongside such a dedicated and compassionate team. Together, we have achieved some really positive outcomes for our residents and for each other. From strengthening our culture and improving communication, to implementing practical changes that support safer, more consistent care, I am incredibly proud of what we have accomplished.

Change is never easy, and that has certainly been evident with the recent allocation changes. While the rollout had a rocky start, I want to acknowledge the effort from the majority of staff who have embraced the new approach and worked together to make it successful.

Following a final review of these changes, we are already seeing clear benefits. There has been a reduction in falls, and during the recent outbreak we were able to quickly identify where staff had worked and keep them allocated to one area. This helped us manage and contain the situation more effectively, demonstrating the value of a consistent allocation model.

We have also seen positive outcomes within the MSU. With more consistent staffing in the unit, team members have been able to bring forward fresh ideas and approaches. This has supported some successful de-escalation of behaviours, and it has been wonderful to see residents spending more time outside of the unit—participating in group activities and enjoying walks.

These outcomes are a reflection of your commitment, adaptability, and genuine care for the people we support. Thank you for the role each of you has played.

As I move forward, I do so with confidence knowing that the service is in good hands and that the team will continue to build on this progress.

Thank you again for your support, your hard work, and for making my time here so meaningful.

Magpies, ibises, and other birds should not be fed human food because it can lead to serious health issues and nutritional imbalances. Human food often lacks the essential nutrients that birds need to thrive in the wild. Feeding them human food can cause digestive problems, lead to obesity, and result in weakened bones due to a lack of calcium. Additionally, feeding them human food can cause them to rely on humans for food, which can be detrimental to their natural behaviour and health.

Environmental Impact

Providing food can disrupt local ecosystems. Birds that become dependent on handouts often neglect natural foraging behaviours. This shift affects the balance of the local food chain. For example, native plants may struggle if birds ignore their seeds. Allowing birds to find their own food helps maintain a healthy environment for you and them.

RESIDENT OF THE MONTH - BERYL

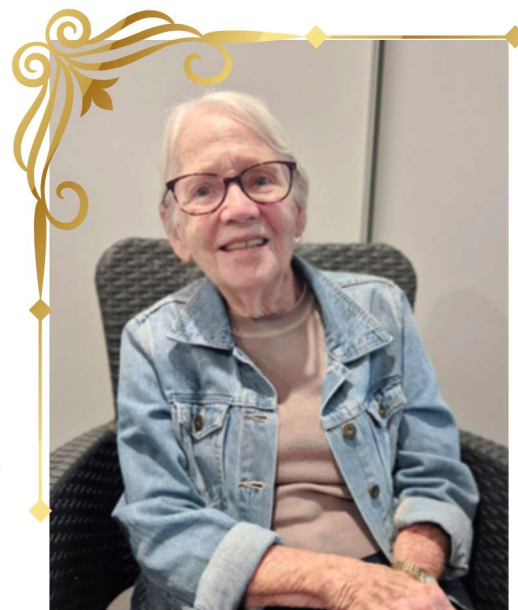
We Welcome Beryl to Beaumont Care Wamuran.

No formal experience is required—just a willingness to share your perspective and work collaboratively with others.

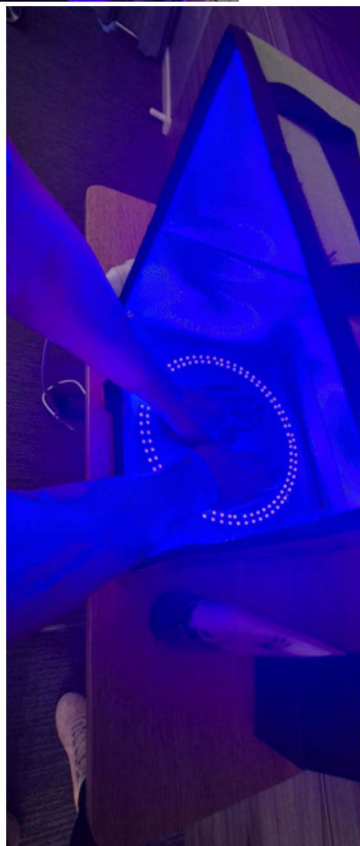
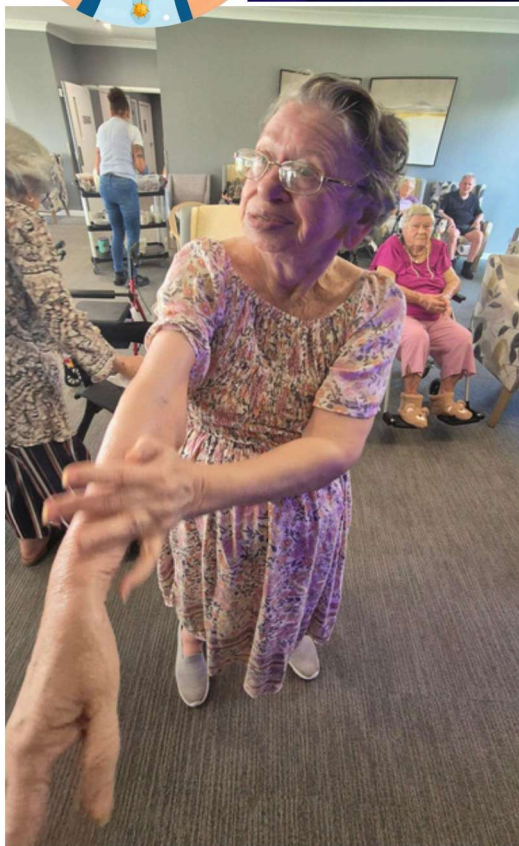
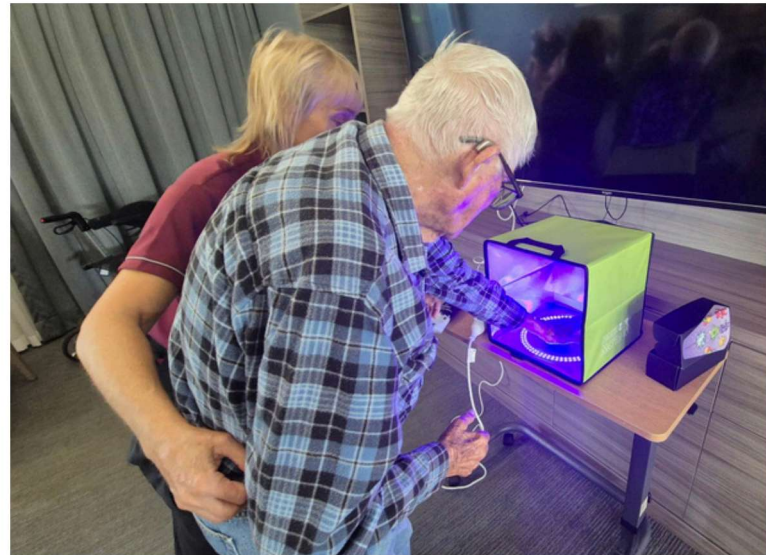
